

Fairtrade West Africa Cocoa Programme: strengths and impact



Strong cooperatives are essential to more sustainable cocoa livelihoods.

The Fairtrade West Africa Cocoa Programme aims to support cooperatives' development into high-functioning organisations that successfully respond to the needs of their members as well as commercial partners.

More than 270 cooperatives in Côte d'Ivoire, Ghana and Sierra Leone participate in a tiered programme of training, coaching, advisory and technical support, and peer-to-peer-learning. The programme is delivered by Fairtrade Africa, the producer network for Fairtrade certified cooperatives in the region.

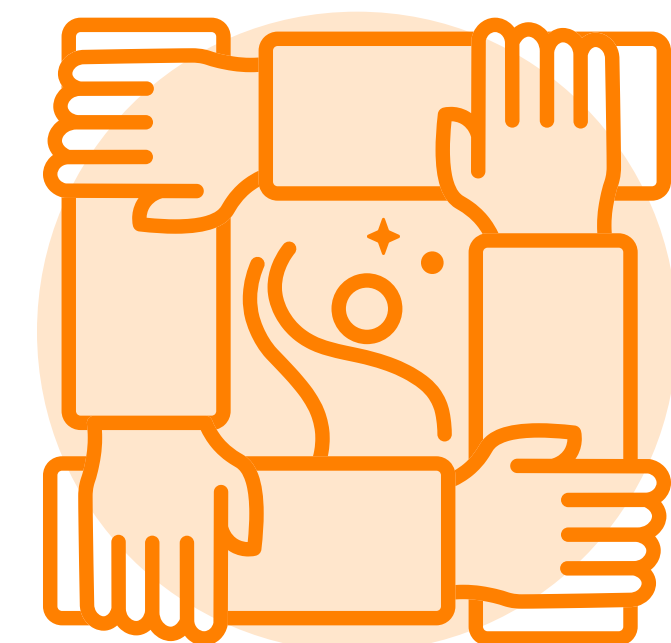
Programme evaluation report 2025

Flexible, tiered services reached more than 51,000 people in 2024

- ▶ 51,891 participants in 2024, including trainings from Fairtrade Africa as well as from farmers trained to "cascade" the learnings to their peers.
- ▶ Cooperatives are grouped and receive different training and services based on the group.
- ▶ Fairtrade Africa meets with cooperatives at the beginning of each year to review the last year and develop the coming year's plan.
- ▶ Services include:
 - Standardised workshops on core topics (including pesticide use, deforestation regulations and human rights)
 - Tailored based on needs and ad-hoc support formats
 - On-site visits, remote support, and informal advisory services

Results highlights

- ▶ Highly trusted and valued by cooperatives, and instrumental in delivering knowledge quickly and efficiently on emerging issues.
- ▶ Stronger, more democratic and participative cooperatives with better management and decision making processes that well positioned for other programmes such as:
 - living income partnerships
 - Women's School of Leadership
 - Child Labour and Forced Labour Prevention Programme Associations
